Dear Mr. O'Connell,

I have the pleasure to extend to World Society of Victimology an invitation to participate as expert observer in an open-ended intergovernmental expert group, mandated by United Nations General Assembly resolution 68/191, to discuss ways and means to more effectively prevent, investigate, prosecute and punish gender-related killing of women and girls, with a view to making practical recommendations, drawing also on current best practices, in consultation with relevant United Nations entities and human rights mechanisms.

The Government of Thailand has offered to host the open-ended intergovernmental expert group meeting in Bangkok, Thailand, from 11 to 13 November 2014. The meeting will be held in all official languages of the United Nations.

Due to the extra-budgetary nature of the meeting, no funds are available for assistance with travel and/or accommodation costs of participants.

In order to facilitate the discussion of the meeting, the United Nations Secretariat has prepared a background paper on gender-related killing of women and girls.
